PRACTITIONER-APPLIED RESEARCH PATHWAY

Applicant(s) must be recognized as an established Hawaiian cultural practitioner by a master of their practice

COMMUNITY-APPLIED RESEARCH PATHWAY

Has strong ties to the community of which the research focuses, includes, or affects, and has a good record of working in, with, and for the community

Applicant(s) must be invested in designing and conducting a formal research project that lends to the formulation of heightened ‘ike

DISSERTATION RESEARCH PATHWAY

Doctoral candidate status within a research-focused doctoral program at an accredited institution

Dissertation research is in a phase where learning from this Fellowship can be incorporated into the research methodology
